



France's Geri Watine and Scotland's Martin Gray shared the top honours in the PGA European Seniors Tour section of the 14<sup>th</sup> Mauritius Open after both men shot two-over-par 74s in the final round.

Watine had led the section after a superb first round 69 but was hauled back by Gray in the second round so that the two men went out together for the final round.

Another Scot, Billy Longmuir, and Irishman Denis O'Sullivan were joint third on 219, one stroke behind Watine and Gray.

Vishnoo Seeneevassen finished as this year's leading Mauritian in the Mauritius Open after a closing round one-over-par 73.

Seeneevassen had a splendid tournament, improving on a first round 75 with scores of 71 and 73 for a respectable total of 219.

Frenchman Freddy Schoettel registered the first ace in the Mauritius Open for many years, holing his tee shot at the 150-metre third hole.

Schoettel struck a six-iron and drew the ball into the green where it pitched three feet from the pin, bounced once and hit the flagstick before dropping into the hole.

The feat helped Schoettel to a closing round 73 for a one-over-par 217 and joint 10<sup>th</sup> position.
